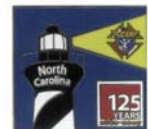

## Vatican declares Knights of Columbus founder "venerable"

Fr. Michael J. McGivney would be first American-born priest to be declared a saint

**New Haven, CT - March 16, 2008** - Pope Benedict XVI Saturday approved a decree recognizing the heroic virtue of Father Michael J. McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus. The pope's declaration significantly advances the priest's process toward sainthood and gives the parish priest the distinction of "Venerable Servant of God." If canonized, Fr. McGivney would be the first American born priest to be so honored.

"All of us who are members of the Knights of Columbus are profoundly grateful for this recognition of the holiness of our founder," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. "The strength of the Knights of Columbus today is a testament to his timeless vision, his holiness and his ideals."

Worried about the religious faith and financial stability of immigrant families, Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus with the help of several men of St. Mary's Parish in New Haven in 1882 to help strengthen the faith of the men of his parish and to provide financial assistance in the event of their death to the widows and orphans they left behind. He was also known for his tireless work among his parishioners.

## State Convention Program Advertisement Sales

Once a year, the Councils and Assemblies in State have an opportunity to be recognized as supporters of the State Council by purchasing an Annual State Convention Program advertisement. Each Council and Assembly whose advertisement appears in the State Convention Program is making a positive statement about how they feel about the Order and the State Council.

Other statements can also be made; such as, the district that purchased a full page advertisement that basically consisted of five 1/8 page advertisements of the four councils in the district, plus the assembly that covers the district. This advertisement sends a strong message about the relationship between the councils and the assembly within that district. It is also cost effective; five 1/8 page advertisements would cost \$175, where a full page advertisement cost \$125.

Realizing that funds may be an issue, the State Convention Program advertisements are priced to fit anyone's budget. You can purchase a Name Line Sponsor for as little as \$20 or a Full Page Advertisement for \$125.

We encourage you to solicit State Convention Program advertisements from businesses that want to be recognized as supporters of the Knights of Columbus. Companies that normally do business with the Knights and companies that would like to do business with the Knights. Also Brothers who own their own businesses and Brothers that are employed by companies that support the Knights. Because 400 to 500 State Convention Programs are distributed statewide, this may be a good vehicle for companies to advertise their businesses.

This year's State Convention Program will feature the State Officers and State Staff. Brother Orrin Lundgren has done an excellent job in designing the 2008 State Convention Program. Hopefully, you will have the same opinion, which will make the 88th Annual State Convention Program a keepsake.

We have received State Convention Program advertisement orders from councils, assemblies, businesses and individuals. In January the advertisement order rate was essentially zero. In February advertisement orders started trickling in at a rate of one or two a week. However, since the first of March, the volume has dynamically increased. Remember, the deadline for ordering a State Convention Program advertisement is April 5th. 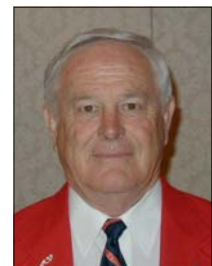
## From The Desk of The State Secretary

The responsibility of the State Secretary in regards to the State Convention are many. The first item on his agenda is to make sure that all Grand Knights have a convention check list with due dates for every item on the list. The Secretary is responsible for all of the credentials of the councils that will be sending delegates to the State Convention. The State Secretary prepares all of the score sheets that will be judged by the State Officers for program awards, Knight of the Year, Family of the Year, Golden Knight of the Year and Rookie of the Year. The State Secretary is also responsible for mailing out the state per capita invoices and receiving the payments from the councils. All state per capita must be paid in full before the council delegates can be seated at the convention. The State Secretary also prepares the Necrology with the help of the councils and reads the entire list at the Convention Mass. This list is also published in the Mass program.

The State Secretary works very closely with the Officers, RDD's, DD's, Staff and the Grand Knights of all councils in the state. This can only be accomplished with the help of the Officers, DD's, and the Grand Knights...to make the convention a complete success.
