District Master's Message

Worthy Sir Knights and Brothers All,

June has been a month that has very busy for many Assemblies across the state. We have had Veterans Day and flag destruction ceremonies, parades, Special Olympics, the passing of Monsignor James Jones, a 100th church anniversary and a number of Assembly Officer Installations. To all who have participated, Thank You! You have taken the time to show others that the Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree is alive and well in North Carolina, and express your Catholicity and Patriotism.



As of this date, June 28th, a number of Assemblies have not yet submitted their Form 186, Officers Chosen For The Term, to the Vice Supreme Master and myself. I have to believe as well, that they have not been submitted to Supreme either. The due date for this submission was Monday, June 30th. Without this form being completed, the Faithful Navigator will not be receiving his communications from Supreme nor will the Assembly be credited with having held elections. It is not difficult! It can be filed electronically from the Supreme web site and copies sent to both the VSM and DM at the same time.

Speaking about new officers for Assemblies, many of you have not yet planned your installations. There is a calendar on the State Council website, enter the Fourth Degree button, showing dates that have been confirmed for this purpose. It is not necessary for you to pick a date that I am available for installations since there are a number of Former Vice Supreme Masters and Masters who are willing to assist with installation ceremonies. Select a date, notify me of the details and I will arrange for someone to be there. Also, when arranging for an installation of officers, please remember, that I will also be bringing the District Marshal or one of the Assistant District Marshals to assist.

In some cases, it may be beneficial for more than one Assembly to join together for their installation. This is a great form of fraternalism since it gives the spouses an opportunity to visit with other Sir Knight wives as well. We often work with members of neighboring Assemblies but it's not often that the wives are included. Something to think about.

Are you having difficulty getting enough men in regalia for an event? Did the Color Corps Commander invite neighboring Assemblies to assist? Let me know what the event is and I will see if I can help get additional men to augment your Honor Guard. We recently had such a situation in Henderson for the 100th anniversary of St. James parish. Please see the note I received from the Faithful Navigator of Assembly 778, SK Tom Dupree.

Communication is so important to the success of our organization. If there is something going on in your area, the Bishop is going to be at your parish, the anniversary of a member of the clergy, etc., please let me know. If I, the VSM or another FVSM or FDM is available, maybe we could have some presence to show our support for the Fourth Degree. We can't attend if we are unaware that something is going on.

Are you recruiting for the Fourth Degree Exemplification to be held on October 25th, at the Embassy Suites Hotel Greensboro Airport? There should be further information contained in this months publication. The cost for a candidate is still \$70.00. For this fee, the candidate receives his social baldric, the Fourth Degree emblem lapel pin and one (1) banquet ticket. Please remind all candidates that the tuxedo shirt must have a standard collar.

have a strategy for the upcoming blitz and an ongoing plan for personal recruitment that

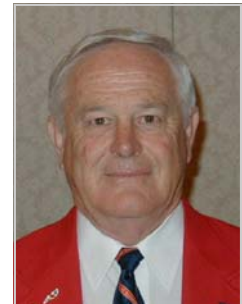

Supreme Director's Message

Brothers,

In April, the Supreme Council Board of Directors and many family members were honored with an invitation to the Papal Welcoming program at the White House, Papal Mass, and Congressional Catholic Prayer Breakfast in Washington, DC. One word described the week – AWESOME. The Mass marked the 200th anniversary of the expansion of Catholicism in the US from one diocese to five dioceses. The theme of the Mass was “Make All New in Christ Our Hope” and was very clearly defined throughout the Holy Father’s homily. An excerpt is as follows:



“I pray, then, that this significant anniversary in the life of the Church in the United States, and the presence of the Successor of Peter in your midst, will be an occasion for all Catholics to reaffirm their unity in the apostolic faith, to offer their contemporaries a convincing account of the hope which inspires them (cf. 1 Pet 3:15), and to be renewed in missionary zeal for the extension of God's Kingdom. The world needs this witness! Who can deny that the present moment is a crossroads, not only for the Church in America but also for society as a whole? It is a time of great promise, as we see the human family in many ways drawing closer together and becoming ever more interdependent. Yet at the same time we see clear signs of a disturbing breakdown in the very foundations of society: signs of alienation, anger and polarization on the part of many of our contemporaries; increased violence; a weakening of the moral sense; a coarsening of social relations; and a growing forgetfulness of Christ and God.”

Christ Our Hope!! The message is clear. As Catholics (as well as all Christians) we must be people of hope. We must spread hope to all that we meet. In our world, in the United States, and right here in North Carolina, there are people drowning themselves in hopelessness. Most of the problems that we have in our world are the result of hopelessness -- murder, gangs, drugs, robbery, abortion, immorality, suicide, euthanasia, terrorism, child abuse, etc. People give in to these sins because they have been persuaded to believe that there is no hope. The Holy Father stated (many times) that we are to be people of hope and that our hope is in Christ our Lord. Without faith in Jesus, hopelessness will prevail. The hope of being with our Lord in heaven keeps us focused on the ultimate goal of serving Him, loving one another, and distancing ourselves from selfish and evil ways. We must be people of hope. The world needs this witness. We must take Our Lord's message of hope to others. We must nourish our faith with prayer, study, and a dedication to serving others. It is only through this hope that we can love one another.

In his recently released bestseller book, “A Civilization of Love”, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson addresses this issue of hope and love in Christ. The parallel to the Holy Father’s challenge is striking. Our Supreme Knight quotes Princeton historian Bernard Lewis “There are times in the long history of the human adventure when we have a real turning point, a major change – the end of an era, the beginning of a new era.” Supreme Knight Anderson states that this turning point is the opportunity to build something great: to build a civilization of love on the basis that we are all “God’s offspring”.

My brother Knights, it is easy to share with you the message of Pope Benedict XVI and Supreme Knight Carl Anderson and the vision of the Knights of Columbus. It is easy because the message is the same. We are consistent with the Holy Father. Christ is our Hope. As followers of Christ, we must bring this hope to others.

As Knights of Columbus, we are especially challenged to be the providers of hope. Our founder, the Venerable Servant of God Fr. Michael McGivney, desired an organization that could be a provider of hope for the family and Church. For 126 years, it has done this. The Church and people in the 1880's were also at a crossroads. Catholics were burdened with prejudice, attacks on their faith, the hardest and most dangerous jobs, and a lack of financial support in the case of the death of the breadwinner. Many Catholics were losing hope and were leaving the Church. Father McGivney knew that this was indeed a turning point. He conceived of an organization that could provide hope – a hope in Christ and His Church. And what a turning point it was.

From the very beginning to today, the Knights of Columbus provides hope through its insurance program. It provides hope to others through our many service programs. Our organization provides hope for ourselves, families, and others through the many programs we foster and support. We make knights better Catholics by providing hope for one another. When we stand "In Solidarity with Our Priests", we help our priests to become more hopeful.

However, in the words of our Supreme Knight and Pope Benedict XVI, there is much more that we can do. Be not afraid! We must be courageous and take this message to our members, families, and others. Christ is our Hope!!
