“The Sacred Triduum”

The weeks of Lent are quickly coming to a close and helping us prepare for the three holiest days of the Church year. Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

The Church purposely does not make Holy Thursday and Good Friday holy days of obligation because, just like on Ash Wednesday, the Church hopes people will “freely” celebrate these days for the honor and love of God.

After a long hard days work, it is difficult to have a quick supper and then go to Church for the Holy Thursday Mass with the washing of feet and the procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Reposition followed by some time in Adoration. It is important to remember that Holy Thursday is not just a re-enactment of what happened two thousand years ago, but a “memorial”, making real again what happened two thousand years ago. We are there in the upper-room with Jesus and the Apostles. Together with Jesus we celebrate the “priesthood” He created so that the sacrament of the Eucharist and the other sacraments would always be there for us; so that the beautiful and power words of the 6th Chapter of St. John’s Gospel about Jesus being our “Bread of Life” will always be available to us; so that the example and command of Jesus to “love one another as I have loved you” would always be the force behind our living our faith in all the areas of our daily lives.

I remember going to Church with my mother and not understanding every thing that was going on, but just watching and listening made me realize this was something very special to God.

For those who are able to go, there should be no need for words to encourage people to attend the 3:00p.m. “Liturgy of the Lord’s Passion”. Love alone should do that.

The Easter Vigil with its “Liturgy of the Light”, “baptism of the Elect; the reception of those coming into full union with the Church” and the Easter Eucharist is the most beautiful celebration of love between ourselves and the Holy Trinity. It is out of love for God for sending Jesus to live and die for our salvation that we celebrate this long Liturgy of remembrance and thanksgiving. Through the symbols, readings and celebration of Eucharist we thank God personally and communally for the greatest things He has done for us and continues to do for us. No Eucharistic celebration through out the whole Church Year says so much to God about our understanding of who we are; where we are going and the means God has given us to reach our heavenly union with the Holy Trinity. The Church enriched the Eucharistic Celebration of Easter so we could have a most beautiful gift to give God in thanksgiving for all He has given us.

Please don’t pass up the opportunity to celebrate these Holy Days. May God bless you and your family this Easter with the graces and blessings He wants most for you to have.

May you all have a blessed Easter and may god look upon with love and grace.



Council 2546 Free Throw Championship

Five boys and two girls from Raleigh, NC ages 9-14 were named local champions for the 2014 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship and have earned the right to compete at the state level. A total of 28 participants competed for the local and district championship. Father Price Council 02546 in Raleigh, NC sponsored the local competition at Magellan Charter School. All youngsters ages 9-14 were eligible to participate.

Hannah Olson (9 years old) was the 10 year old girls' champion and Kate Kilpatrick (9 years old) was second place.

Jacob Glover was the winner of the 10 year old boys' division with Luke Mulik in second place. Jacob and Luke tied and had to shoot 5 extra free throws to determine a winner.

Langdon Aronson was the 11 year old champion with David Dixon coming in second place.
