“10 Facts About WW II You May Or May Not Know”

1. On September 1, 1939 when the European war started, the U.S. Army had 147,000 men. On December 7, 1941 the army's strength was, (including National Guard) 1,686,000. by the end of the war in Europe the Army strength was 8,300,000 men & women.
2. One fire bomb raid against Tokyo in March, 1945 by 279 B-29 bombers killed 83,783 persons. That's more than were killed when the A-bomb was dropped on Nagasaki in August, 1945. That killed 70,000 although by the end of 1945 the total dead was 140,000 due to radiation.
3. When the Japanese invaded Nanking in 1931 and again in 1939, known as the “Rape of Nanking”, the Japanese besides raping over 20,000 Chinese women. Bayoneted, machine gunned and set fire to 200,000 men.
4. The failure of the German air power over the Normandy beaches caused the German soldiers to say: “If the plane in the sky is silver, it's American, if it's blue, it's British and if it's invisible.....It's Ours”.
5. Private Charles Hillman of the 101st Airborne Division was getting ready to jump into Normandy on June 6th 1944. Before jumping, paratroopers troopers checked them for a final inspection. Looking at the label on his chute he noticed it was made & packed by the Pioneer Parachute Co. of Connecticut, his home state. When he looked closer at the inspection he couldn't believe who inspected his chute, It was his Mother's name, who worked at the Pioneer Parachute Co.
6. The entire white population of Dutch Borneo were executed when the Japanese invaded that oil rich nation in January, 1942.
7. A U.S. soldier fighting in Europe in the winter of 1944 said: “The German 88mm, the most feared artillery piece the Germans had, when fired sounded like the gongs of hell.”
8. Of the 433 Medals of Honor awarded to U.S. servicemen in WW II, 219 of them were given after the recipients death.
9. On D-Day in Normandy the U.S put 11,000 B-17's and B-24's in the skies. Each bomber carrying 8,000 lbs. of bombs....DO THE MATH!
10. Washington D.C. was the only Allied or Axis capital not bombed in WW II.
